

Day 1 - Welcome To Israel - Arrive Tel Aviv

Tauck's Jordan and Israel travel days begin at 6:30 PM at the InterContinental David Tel Aviv. A transfer is included from Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion Airport to the InterContinental David Tel Aviv, set on a beachfront promenade, with sweeping views of the Mediterranean, in the city's most fashionable neighborhood. Day 2 - Explore Tel Aviv

Today reveals some of the striking contrasts that define Israel. Your guide will give you a brief Hebrew lesson during our welcome briefing before we set off for a walking tour through the maze of narrow, cobblestone streets of 4,000-year-old Jaffa, believed to be the oldest port city in the world. An afternoon tour of Tel Aviv reveals its modern energy, its progressive ambiance and some of 4,000 Bauhaus-architecture buildings that give the city its nickname, the "White City."

Day 3 - Caesarea, Drive To Haifa

Over a period of just 12 years, Herod transformed Caesarea into a grand city and major seaport - and dedicated it to Roman Emperor Caesar Augustus, who had returned it to Herod after wresting it away from Cleopatra. During a walking tour, view the remains of Herod's palace and a spectacular Roman amphitheater that is still used as a performance venue today. After lunch, continue on to Haifa, international headquarters of the Baha'i Faith, and the Baha'i Shrine and Gardens on famous Mount Carmel. A succession of 19 manicured garden terraces lead down to the Shrine of the Bab, entombing the remains of the Bab, Baha'i Allah, the herald of the Baha'i Faith. Enjoy dinner at the hotel.

Day 4 - Sea Of Galilee Nazareth

The Sea of Galilee is a must-see destination during any Israel travel experience. At the Yigal Alon Museum, you'll view an amazing treasure that rocked the worlds of archaeology, history and faith when it was discovered along the Sea of Galilee in 1986 - the remains of an extraordinary 2,000 year-old fishing boat that dates back to the time and place of Jesus. You'll discover sites that are an integral part of Christianity during a cruise aboard a similar boat on the Sea of Galilee. Later, learn to dance the Hora, a traditional Jewish folk dance done in concentric circles. A visit to a kibbutz will reveal the history and modern-day life in these communities. Stop in Nazareth for lunch at a local restaurant. You'll learn more about the Baha'i Faith as well as the other main religions in Israel - Judaism, Christianity, Islam and Druze - during an exclusive private "Prophet Sharing" panel discussion this afternoon.

Day 5 - Akko Drive To Jerusalem

Today you'll travel to one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the world, Akko (or Acre) dating back to the era of the Egyptian pharaoh Thutmose. Begin your time in this richly historic city with a visit to the Jezzar Pasha Mosque. An excellent example of Ottoman architecture, the mosque is named for Ahmed al-Jezzar Pasha, who defeated Napoleon at the 1799 French siege of Akko. A walking tour through the walled city takes in the Knight's Hall, the citadel and prison, as well as ancient tunnels. Traces of the Egyptians, Greeks, Romans, Muslims, Crusaders, Ottomans, Bedouins and the British (who have all ruled here)can be seen, as well as evidence of the 1948 Arab-Israeli War. After lunch, continue on to Jerusalem, with a stop at the Mount of Olives for a scenic view out over the city.

Day 6 - Explore Jerusalem

For three of the world's great religions, Judaism, Islam and Christianity, Jerusalem is indeed a holy city of incredible significance. Guided by a local expert, we begin our walking tour of the Old City in the Jewish Quarter and the Cardo, which dates back to the 2nd century AD and is today a bustling marketplace with intriguing goods for sale. Reflecting the area's Roman influences, the Cardo was a wide avenue and a common element in the design of many ancient Roman cities. Hosting shops, merchants, and vendors, the Cardo typically served as a local center of economic life. Our walking tour ends at the iconic Western Wall, a remnant of the Second Temple set beneath the site known to Jews as the Temple Mount and as al-Haram al-Sharif to Muslims. While it has been among Judaism's most holy prayer sites for over 2,000 years, people of other religions, such as President Barack Obama and popes John Paul II and Benedict XVI, have also left prayer notes in the cracks and crevices of the wall. After lunch, visit Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Martyrs' and Heroes' Remembrance Authority, and explore this living memorial to the Holocaust and those who perished in it. Enjoy an afternoon at leisure to explore Jerusalem on your own.

Day 7 - The Old City Dome Of The Rock

This morning, visit the traditional site of the tomb of King David's son, Absalom, who led a rebellion against his father during the 1st century AD. At the Temple Mount, discover the holiest Islamic site in Jerusalem, the Dome of the Rock. A walk on the Via Dolorosa, the route along which Jesus carried the cross to the site of his crucifixion, is a most meaningful experience for many Christian pilgrims. Explore the Via Dolorosa before continuing on to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, built on the location of the crucifixion and one of the holiest Christian sites in the world. Join us tonight for a cooking demonstration at a local restaurant featuring one of Jerusalem's most unique dining experience prior to a reception followed by a sound and light show at the Tower of David.

Day 8 - Tour Bethlehem, Explore Jerusalem

Following breakfast, you have a choice of spending additional time exploring Jerusalem on your own or traveling on a guided sightseeing excursion to Bethlehem. Those opting for the excursion will pass through the checkpoint into Palestinian-controlled Bethlehem for a walking tour of the Church of the Nativity. Built over what is traditionally thought to be the birthplace of Jesus, it is one of the oldest continuously operating churches in the world. Beneath the elaborate church lies the Grotto of the Nativity, where a silver star in the floor marks the very spot where Christ is believed to have been born, with the Chapel of the Manger just steps away. Visit the Milk Grotto, then return to Jerusalem. You are free to explore Jerusalem as you please this afternoon.

Day 9 - Masada Dead Sea, Jordan

Travel to the cliff-top fortress at Masada, a UNESCO World Heritage Site built by King Herod between 36 and 31 BC. The fortress was a mighty stronghold of Jewish Zealots who fled Jerusalem rather than submit to Roman rule during the First Jewish-Roman War in the 1st century AD. Take a cable car to the top of the mountain with a knowledgeable guide to explore the site, learn the story of what happened here over 2,000 years ago, and discover why Masada has such tremendous significance today. Following lunch, your time in Israel draws to a close as we journey across the border into Jordan and drive to the Dead Sea.

Day 10 - Tour Of Jerash

Day 11 - Drive To Petra

On a clear day, Jericho, the Dead Sea, the River Jordan and even Jerusalem can be seen from Mount Nebo, known as Pisgah in the Bible. Explore the Memorial Church of Moses and its well-preserved, 6th-century mosaics. Traveling south through ancient biblical lands, we'll stop first in Madaba to visit St. George's Greek Orthodox Church and view an incredible 6th-century mosaic map of all the major biblical sites of the time. A part of the original Cathedral of Madaba, the map would have taken an estimated 11,500 hours to complete. Afterward, enjoy a feast of authentic Jordanian cuisine at lunch.

Day 12 - Explore The Pink City Of Petra

The 2,000-year-old city of Petra, which the ancient Nabataeans carved out of colorful sandstone cliffs, has recently been named one of the "New Seven Wonders of the World," and is quite simply amazing. Almost forgotten for over a thousand years and protected by the cliff of Edom, Petra is one of the best-preserved biblical sites in the world. You'll travel through the narrow, high-walled canyon called the Siq... and suddenly, there it is, the huge and world-famous Treasury - your first sight is one of those life-transforming moments. View Petra's tomb facades, royal tombs, temples and other structures on foot... the best way to appreciate them. After lunch, return part way by came! Please join us for our farewell cocktail reception and dinner including entertainment this evening.




Day 14 - Homeward Bound
